INDIGENOUS GROUPS

Drum Circle

We will make a traditional hand drum supported by the Circle Of Indigenous Nations Society and a community Elder. We will come together every Fridays at lunch to share teachings of the drum and learn songs that have been gifted to our community to drum and sing together.

Indigenous Arts

We come together every Tuesday at lunch and learn how to make traditional arts and crafts. We will bring in community knowledge keepers to share their expertise with the group. Snacks and refreshments provided.

Poplar Ridge

Every Wednesday during B block I take a group of students to Poplar Ridge the old age care facility in the Trail Hospital to engage with the Elderly. Indigenous Cultures hold up and support their Elders and even though these Elderly people are not "in" our community they are still a part of our community.
